Children 12 to 16 years old — One lozenge to be dissolved slowly in the mouth every 2 — 3 hours up to a maximum of 8 lozenges in 24 hours
Remove one lozenge from the foll blister packaging.

Replace the foll blister back into the cardboard carm.

Dissolve one lozenge slowly in the mouth every 2 — 3 hours, it is not recommended that children under 12 years use this medicine.

1. What this medicine is and what it is used for

One lozenge contains no more than 22.04 micrograms of gluten. If you have wheat allergy (different from coeliac disease) you should not take this

 This medicine contains 1.89 mg propylene glycol in each lozenge
 This medicine contains fragrance with Benzyl Alcohol, Cinnamyl Alcohol, Citral, Citranellol, d-Limonene, Linalool (all present in Spearmint flavour), Linalool and d-limonene (present in Cool Mint Sensation flavour) and d-limonen (present in Eucalyptus oil). Benzyl Alcohol, Cinnamyl Alcohol, Citral, Citranellol, d-Limonene, Eugenol and Linalool may cause allergic reactions.

Do not take a double dose to make up for a forgotten lozenge. Continue to use this medicine normally. If you have any further questions on the use of this medicine, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

4. Possible side effects
Like all medicines, this medicine can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them. If you experience any hypersensitivity to this medicine i.e. itching, burning sensation and/or discomfort of the mouth, difficulty in breathing, swelling of the face, neck, tongue or throat and rash (severe allergic reactions) stop taking this medicine and consult your doctor or pharmacist. If any of the side effects gets serious, or if you notice any side effects not listed in this leaflet, please tell your doctor or pharmacist.

Reporting of side effects

If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor, pharmacist or nurse. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet. You can also report side effects directly via the Yellow Card Scheme at:

Keep out of the sight and reach of children. Do not use this medicine after the expiry date which is stated on the carton after EXP. The expiry date refers to the last day of that month and the year. Do not store above 25°C Medicines should not be disposed of via wastewater or household waste. Ask your pharmacist how to dispose of medicines no longer required. These measures will help to protect the environment.

6. Contents of the pack and other information

What this medicine contains:

The active substances are: 2,4-Dichlorobenzyl alcohol 1.2mg and Amylmetacresol 0.6mg The other ingredients are: Xylitol, cool mint sensation flavour (contains propylene glycol), Levomenthol, Spearmint, Eucalyptus Oil, Liquid Sucrose, Liquid Glucose (containing wheat starch (containing Gluten) and Sulphites – Sulphur Dioxide (E220)), fragrance allergens - Benzyl Alcohol, Cinnamyl Alcohol, Citral, Citranellol, d-Limon Eugenol and Linalool.

What this medicine looks like
